Reception & year 1

Writing task	Find a photograph in your house and ask your child to write about it. It can be as simple as words to describe the person/scene or some sentences explaining what is going on in

Reading	Ask your child to read to their school book to you or read them a book from home.
Additional tasks	Ask your child to choose 1 of the following:

Year 2 & KS2

Spelling	Ask your child to practise their weekly spellings using look, write, cover, check. They can also write their spellings into sentences.
Writing task	Find a photograph in your house and ask your child to write about it. It can be as simple as describing the person/scene or as more of a challenge writing a story based around the image.

Maths task	Continue times tables practise using Times Tables Rock Stars
Reading	Ask your child to spend a minimum of 15 minutes reading either their book from school or a book from home.
Additional tasks	Ask your child to choose 1 of the following:
