
Year 4—Temples, Tombs and Treasures



Ancient Egypt c. 3000 BC - 30 BC

The Ancient Egyptian Era occurred while Britain was experiencing the Bronze and Iron Age.

The rich Egyptians preserved bodies of the dead so that they would enter the afterlife in good condition. This process is called mummification.

The Ancient Egyptians built pyramids as resting places for the Pharaohs.

Tutankhamun's tomb was discovered by Howard Carter in 1922.



Hieroglyphics was an ancient writing system used by the Ancient Egyptians. They often wrote on papyrus paper and cartouches.


This half term our assemblies are themed around the power of Your Voice. Our voice is a powerful tool to support our wellbeing,
