As writers, we will be exploring different stories with links to the senses. We will be sequencing and retelling them focussing on spaces between our words, capital letters, full stops and using what we've learned in phonics and applying it to our spelling.

SENSES - YEAR 1

Wray Common Citizens

This half term our assemblies will explore the British values of *democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs*. Addition:

Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs. Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20.

Solve one-step problems that involve subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems.

Curriculum Coverage

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be focusing on **Anti-Bullying and Conflict Resolution**.

We will discuss that there are different types of teasing and bullying and understand the difference between bullying and falling out with their friends.

RE
